Páramo was set up by Nikwax's founder, Nick Brown, with a mission to improve people's outdoor experience by developing outdoor clothing with real improvements over existing gear – and so it has continued...

Fabric innovation

1984 Nikwax Analogy waterproof fabric was radical when Nick first engineered its design and tested it in the Andes, based on the principles of how mammal fur works. This Directional fabric set new standards in 'breathability', being able to move liquid water as well

liquid water as well as water vapour — and working in all conditions, whatever humidity or temperature.



Parameta S temperature control fabric – reversible magic! Wear the smooth side to the skin to cool you, fleecy side in to stay warm and dry.

2001 Rapid evaporation fabric Parameta A introduced for trek & travel wear – this phenomenally quick-drying fabric uses every last drop of perspiration to cool you, protects against harmful UV rays and deters biting insects.

2009 New lightweight Analogy waterproof fabric arrives – perfect for those travelling 'fast & light'.

2012 Parameta G fabric brought in for rapid response baselayers — combining efficient moisture removal with insulation when covered with a wind- or waterproof, or quick cooling when exposed.

Functional rethink

1995 Páramo introduce 'front of the arm vents' that actually let warm air out and cool air in rather than being trapped under the arm in conventional 'pit zips'.

1996 Upside down gaiters – simple but effective! Easy use and simple access with Páramo gaiters as the front zip opens from the bottom.

2006 Overlayering – the Páramo solution to staying warm in the cold and wet. Torres insulation is worn over your waterproofs – far more practical than carrying an extra fleece layer to put on.

2009 Separate Sleeves – Torres insulation for the arms has to be experienced to be believed.

Arms are crucial to whole body comfort and immediately you don the sleeves you feel the impact – with minimum weight to carry.

2009 How to put on trousers outdoors! Páramo's alternative to balancing on one foot or sitting down in the mud, the Torres insulating trousers and Quito waterproof trousers make it easy to quickly cover up your legs with a crafty zip on/ zip off construction. You can even put trousers on

over skis!

Professional input

1990 Nick asked mountain instructor Greg Care to develop the first Páramo garment. Greg still oversees elements of design and testing from his Lakes base, placing gear on test

with outdoor pros.

2005 Pájaro Jacket introduced with key input from Nature professionals. Páramo is the choice of wildlife watchers such as cameraman John Aitchison, photographer Andy Rouse, plus plenty of notable wildlife television presenters!

2010 Mountain Pro gear introduced in direct response to requests for Mountain Rescue

teams around the UK. Some 30 Rescue teams already choose Páramo for their uniform, as well as British Antarctic Survey, Natural England and the National Trust for Scotland.



As a British Medical Doctor who's lived, worked and travelled through 60 countries, I'm used to life at the extreme. I'm working one year in Antarctica, conducting human spaceflight research for the European Space Agency. The only British expedition member, I live alongside a crew of 12 European scientists at Concordia Station, a French-Italian inland research station, at 75°06′06″S - 123°23′43″E, 3800 metres equivalent altitude (caused by very low air pressure) on the Antarctic Plateau – the world's largest and coldest desert. Alongside the hypoxia we suffer, struggling for each breath on exertion, we endure the world's coldest temperatures ever recorded dropping below -80°C.

I travelled 17,500 km through rain, blizzards, snow and ice to get here, to dive headfirst into Antarctic winter – the worst in the world. The current outside temperature is -73°C with wind chill below -90°C. You risk your life each time you go outside. With 3 months complete darkness, it's like living on the dark side of the moon. We're completely isolated from February to November – no opportunity for emergency medical evacuation or equipment resupply.

Put simply, Concordia is in the world's most extreme and hostile environment, the closest anyone can come to living on another planet — I call it Planet Concordia — making it one of the most authentic space analogue environments.

I chose Páramo clothing as Páramo have been official supplier to the British Antarctic Survey (BAS) for many years, so I knew their products could survive these extreme conditions. In fact, I'm wearing 'Antarctic history' — Páramo's BAS clothing was a contender for the 100th object in BBC Radio 4's fascinating series, 'A History of the World in 100 objects'.

Stopping by their London store,
I was hugely impressed and reassured
when their systems and fabrics
were explained to me. Being active
outdoors here keeps you warm but
you risk losing heat via moisture
build-up. Páramo allows me to
maintain a stable body temperature
and moisture never gets a chance to
make me suffer.

I use the Torres overlayering Jacket and Core and practically live in my Torres Trousers – testament to their comfort.

For protection against the elements, like BAS I use an Aspira Smock and Salopettes which are versatile, strong, waterproof but breathable, and offer high visibility in case of an emergency. Important for those needing to keep their hands free, spacious pockets with easy access hold vital equipment life-saving medication, photography items or delicate scientific instruments awaiting installation. The system has proven itself again and again, crouching and kneeling on 3,233 metres of ice, beside our resident Glaciologist, packaging snow samples far from the warmth of base on Planet Concordia!



Over the last 10 years the UK UIAA/ICAR/ISMM and University of Leicester Diploma of Mountain Medicine has trained well over 100 doctors, nurses and paramedics from the UK and abroad in mountain medicine skills.

The four module course consists of theoretical teaching plus extensive practical mountain training in Snowdonia, the Scottish Highlands and European Alps. Páramo have repeatedly supported the Scottish module by the loan of clothing for participants. In February/ March 2012 the course was again run in Lochaber with help from the local mountain rescue team and staff at the Belford Hospital in Fort William. Medical students in Scotland can apply for a Belford placement on the grounds of interest in mountain activities, so over the years we have mercilessly press-ganged them as "dummies" for our cliff rescue scenarios.

Diploma delegates navigate out of mist, snow, sleet, rain and wind to find a couple of "casualties" stranded on a muddy cliff. Our UIAGM guiding team and faculty doctors carefully monitor their mountain and medical skills. For the dummies this means two days of repeated exposure to the elements waiting for rescue — several hours each day of misery masquerading as an opportunity for good, but unique, medical training.

This year delegates turned up at the incident wearing a variety of Aspira jackets, trousers and salopettes but the student 'casualties' had sensibly grabbed all the Torres jackets and trousers. These are generally too warm for those navigating but ideal for the "dummies". I'm pleased to report that the hypothermia they were meant to suffer as part of the scenario was well acted but certainly not real, despite lying on exposed ledges for several hours. Also impressive was the way the clothing kept the students dry and recovered well from the wet peaty mud coating where the subjects lay.

The student victims appeared happy when offered a free dinner and dram after the day's education and specifically thanked the staff at Páramo who seemed to have their welfare at heart!

Last winter the temperature went up and down like a yo-yo with huge amounts of precipitation. We had massive dumps of snow building up to 2.6m on the higher slopes and I had the joy of walking through a winter wonderland! On the minus side, when the temperature suddenly rose we got constant rain with dampness that makes you feel cold.

I started the season in December on an avalanche course in the Chamonix Valley – two weeks before the slopes had been green. We ploughed through knee-high powder with great fluffy flakes of snow falling constantly. However, mostly we were standing around as people took turns burying and finding transceivers. I soon felt cold so put on my new kit addition: the Torres Jacket, which warmed me in moments. It is lightweight and folds so small you barely notice it in your rucksack.

Snowshoeing is growing in popularity – it allows walkers to access mountain walks even in deepest winter. I lead snowshoe walks ranging from the gentle to quite serious and have to carry spare kit for myself and the group; the Torres Jacket quickly became an important part of my kit. It is difficult to get the right combination of clothes when snowshoeing as the external temperature is often below freezing but you soon warm up as walking is so aerobic – a warm layer which can be placed over a waterproof when needed is ideal. The Torres Jacket fits the bill as it also stays warm when wet.

When not snowshoeing I go skiing (what a terrible life!). Some days this season it has been extremely cold, -10°C and below with the wind chill, so I have worn the Torres over my ski jacket. It's roomy without being bulky with large pockets great for storage of extra hats etc. I feel really smug when other skiers are saying they are so cold they can hardly bear it and I am snug as a bug in a rug!

A few months back we undertook an expedition to Tajikistan to climb in the Pamir Mountains, known as the 'roof of the world'. They lie between several significant ranges such as the Himalayas, Tian Shan, Karakoram, and the Hindu Kush.

We trekked into a valley which the locals said mountaineers had never set foot in before. The first day we recced the area and discovered some great peaks surrounding base camp.

The Aspira trousers were ideal for attempting these unclimbed peaks

as we had a range of temperatures to deal with. In the valleys you could zip open the sides as you set off for your climb from basecamp. Higher up, the knee and bum padding ensured you didn't get frostbite in those areas whilst belaying. Zipped up, they kept the snow and cold out very well.

Between the team of nine we went up eight mountains over 5,000m unlikely to have been climbed before. At the very least we did new routes, mostly up some terrific north faces. There's a lot more out there waiting to be summited for the first time. On another expedition to the Arctic, my team crammed into an emergency bothy shelter one day, thinking it was a 12-man one. It's not a good idea to squeeze 13 people into an 8-man bothy, especially with crampons on. I was beside my superb co-leader, Andy Ruck, and was very glad to have Aspiras on, with their great padding, as his crampons hit my bum. The foam panel saved me from a painful and embarrassing outcome. It's the only time on that exped we didn't get on really well!

Having chatted with photographers about how to stay cool going up hill, warm at the top when you're stationary for long periods, then a happy medium for the way down when you're not working so hard – I'd hit a bit of a wall in terms of 'do it all' clothing.

One day someone suggested Páramo had really innovative gear and – already owning a pair of their excellent Cascada Trousers (that let you crawl around in long grass for hours without ending up sodden) – I was keen to try more. Visiting the Outdoor Show in London I left with a Mountain Pull-on and Torres Trousers.

As someone who suffers the cold to the point of coming out in hives, but spends a good deal of time at the top of the hills, light, packable items offering excellent insulation are a must. The Torres Trousers didn't disappoint – on a pre-dawn hike into the westerly hills on the Isle of Arran, with an ambient air temperature of -7°C and a northerly to knock you off your feet, I was as warm and toasty as if I was sitting at the fireside at home. Well, nearly. Even better, they pack into a tiny space in the camera bag, ready to whip out on the summit, their unique fastening meaning they can be put on over trousers and boots without expert gymnastics.

As for the Mountain Pull-on, I've rarely been out of it, whether hiking up hills taking photographs or slogging my bike on the local trails. The luxuriant feel of the super soft inside does nothing to detract from its superb wicking capabilities. As someone who normally opts for a quick change of base layer at the top of the hill, I'm very glad to skip this step and carry on with the same gear I wore on the way up!

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I have walked the South West Coast Path, the West Highland Way and climbed all 214 Wainwright Fells in the Lake District, many of them more than once and in all weathers. I have been wearing Páramo clothing for my walking for probably ten years now. I have yet to find its equal for comfort and functionality — you hardly know you are wearing it, which is as it should be! It is soft, extremely comfortable, and it is easy to regulate your body temperature with arm and leg zips. I find their layering system works particularly well.

Cambia Boxers, Cambia long or short sleeved Tee and my recently acquired Velez Adventure Light Smock and Velez Adventure Light Trousers are sufficient for most conditions. When conditions turn a little colder, the Torres Sleeves make a world of difference – as I experienced in a vicious hail stone storm on Blencathra in the Lake District. I was as warm as toast within my Velez combination and Torres Sleeves whilst all around turned white and frozen.

The great thing about Páramo is that you don't need to carry other items like Waterproof Jackets and Overtrousers because you are already wearing them, so less weight to carry on your travels, more room in your rucksack, and less time spent faffing

about with changing clothing, sometimes in inclement conditions.

On a trip to Scafell Pike in the snow last year I wore the Cambia base layers, the Cascada Trousers and the Alta Jacket in temps of -5°C with a biting windchill. I was amazed that I remained warm and comfortable throughout the day without the need for any mid layers. I have set out to walk the South West Coast Path again, in the opposite direction this time, and, of course, Páramo will be with me every step of the way.

The National Trust for Scotland Munro Challenge was a venture to raise awareness of the Trust's countryside properties, particularly the work carried out by our hard-pressed footpath maintenance team.

'High Ambition' is a personal account of that Challenge

– to climb all 46 of the Trust
Munros in one year, culminating in an ascent of Ben Lawers
on the 155th anniversary of
Sir Hugh Munro's birth.

Throughout the year taken to climb

the 46 Munros in the Trust's care, I wore Páramo, which has stood me in good stead for many years. Cascada Trousers are a great piece of versatile kit. Their flexibility perfectly suits the sudden variations of weather for which Scottish mountains are well known. They kept me comfortable and dry in stormy conditions, snow and mist — and with the venting zips even in the blistering hot sun. I used the Quito jacket in wet weather. I'm used to wearing this for day trips into mountains, as well as for cycling, to keep rain at bay. It's both light to carry and performs extremely well.

Cambia base layers were comfortable and wicked moisture effectively. Combined with the Mountain Vent, they kept me warm (or cool depending on conditions) throughout. When wind chill made the temperature drop, a Fuera Windproof was all I needed to keep up the level of comfort.

The torture test.

Ian Maxwell, Shadowhawk co.uk

I run a wildlife tracking school, travelling the world to track some of the world's most dangerous animals in some of the most hostile environments – deserts, jungles, the frozen north of Eastern Europe to the Himalayas. I've sought weird and wonderful animals, including the Yeti in the Himalayas, the Sasquatch and the mythical big cats roaming the UK. I can't take risks with equipment

— if it fails, the consequences could be dire. So I apply my torture test. I use the clothing until it fails or just keeps working. If it gets through, that's the kit I use, knowing it won't let me down when the going gets tough.

I chose Páramo because it keeps me dry and keeps the wind off. It can be repaired in the field, and doesn't rustle, so I get closer to wildlife. This week a deer came right up and still didn't spot me.

My Páramo smock is jam-packed with really useful features — and it survived my torture test with flying colours!





Cold? Least of my worries!

I always told people "I really feel the cold". But I love being outside and active. Fine in summer but in winter I'd be bundled up like Michelin man – veering wildly between too cold and too hot. I went to a Páramo demonstration, but couldn't really believe that a garment so soft and light could keep me warm and dry! However, I bit the bullet and bought a Velez Adventure Light (and a Reversible Shirt just in case I got cold!)

It stood up very well to lashing rain on a canal boat trip recently - rain was dripping off my nose but I was snug and dry. It has come on numerous climbing trips – surviving the rigours of Peak District gritstone and Pembrokeshire sandstone. If that wasn't enough, I wore it on a 15 hour traverse attempt on the Cuillin Ridge. With a combination of gusting winds, and 10 metre visibility making navigation questionable at best, plus my first abseil, the only constant was that, for the first time in my life, I was neither too warm nor too cold.

With an ever-growing respect for this lightweight, versatile piece of clothing, I decided to test it further by going for a vomp up Snowdon in 80 mph winds and blizzard conditions. I was fine. Better than fine in fact!

My first ice-climb took me to Idwal

Stream, a more-or-less gentle romp uphill (WI II/III) in a slight blizzard. Yes, I got warm on the walk-in but the venting in the jacket soon evened things out again and the blizzard didn't bother me one bit. My second ice-climb was much more testing. I dressed in a baselayer, my Parameta S and my Velez. A surprisingly hard WI IV/V up South Gully left me exposed on a belay ledge for an hour, but luckily I was left with a Torres belay jacket so was relatively warm. Despite being exhausted, mentally and physically, during this climb and worried whether I'd make it to the top of South Gully alive (joke, mum!), I definitely wasn't worried about being cold!





Two years later I've completed 32 marathons including races of 45, 50, 100 and 105 continuous miles. I hold a World Record and on July 11th I was very honoured to be an Olympic Torchbearer selected for the thousands of pounds I've raised for charity through running.

To date I have never failed to finish a race even in the most horrendous conditions – and my Ladies' Velez Adventure Light Waterproof Smock has played a huge part in this.

I purchased my smock shortly after my first marathon when heading out on the 3 Peaks Challenge (Ben Nevis, Scafell Pike and Mt Snowdon in under 24 hours). I feel the cold so wanted a jacket warm enough for freezing temperatures on Scafell Pike in the middle of the night, yet cool, lightweight and flexible enough to run down Ben Nevis in afternoon sunshine. I got just that with my new smock and had a fantastic run, completing the challenge in 22 hours.

I'm often referred to as 'The Lady in the Green Coat!' as I take my smock everywhere with me. It was worn during the full 45 miles from Wendover to Little Venice in January where I finished as 3rd lady in the

Country to Capital ultra race. The temperature at the start was -6°C and I was all zipped up, in glorious winter sunshine at the finish I was unzipped and cool as a cucumber.

In the Thames Path 100 ultra race in March, my smock kept me dry and warm through the horrendous weather in the final hours of the race. After 22+ hours on your feet your condition can deteriorate rapidly. Hypothermia can quickly take hold when exposed to the cold as your body has no energy left to keep warm. My smock has kept me alive many times! The front pocket is fantastic for storing phone, gloves, maps, snacks, torch etc and the hood keeps your head warm.

As a Mum, I do ordinary things too! I enjoy family bike rides, walking to school, and – you guessed it – I use my smock for those too. The one item in my wardrobe I couldn't live without!

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The trip of a lifetime to Hemis National Park. Few words can describe such a rare and beautiful sight – the Snow Leopard, truly the ghost of the mountains.

A couple of days to acclimatise to 3,500m altitude then we're off for the wilderness foothills of the Himalayas, the very tip of Northern India. A journey not for the faint-hearted, the rubble track lies inches from a sheer drop, interjected with hairpin bends, randomly placed machinery and local workforces repairing the road.

Setting up camp by the river of crystal clear, ice cold mountain spring water seemed guite normal in this newly discovered wonderland. It felt unspoiled, like we were the first to find it.

There followed five days of trekking goat tracks, up rock escarpments and 'skiing' down slate-screed mountain sides, breathing unspoiled mountain air with never-ending snow-capped mountain peaks always in the distance.

Scrambling up rocks before breakfast to see a distant Snow Leopard crossing the mountain above our campsite is a memory carved not only as an image, but also as a feeling of pure freedom – and, quite simply, painful to leave behind.

If you experience this for yourself, wear Páramo! It's lightweight and packs to nothing – excellent when you have to squeeze everything into a day bag and carry it. Their baselayers, waterproof and windproof clothing systems were exactly what I needed when facing nature's elements in this extreme environment.







I showed a talent for losing


My Leatherman (left in my living room) plus a sleeping mat that fell off my bag. It was a tough expedition, successful my Torres. I'd agonised over the choice of belay jacket and eventually settled on, the then new, Torres Smock. It had not disappointed when taken to the Alps in winter and in summer for an optimistic high altitude bivvy. But on our descent from the Sarychat glacier I was overloaded and somewhere on route my Torres deserted my pack.

Fast forward to 2011, back on the approach to Sarychat. We'd returned for the impressive 5.200m peak at the head of the glacier, still unclimbed. I'd found parts of my sleeping mat, apparently shredded for bedding by

Marmots, so was keeping an eye out but costly. What annoyed me most was for my Torres too. To my amazement, crossing from behind a large boulder, an unmistakable Nikwax Analogy badge stared up from the stream bed. Half buried in shale lay my Torres! I pulled it out and rinsed it off a bit. It had collected a fair bit of sediment in bleaching being what the river over 2 years but looked intact. it is... Still it's now easily


